Switzerland admits to littering problem

Amid mounting litter difficulties in Switzerland a parliamentary committee has approved a penalty for littering equal to \$329 and wants to know what the political parties, institutions and organizations think about this before the proposal is voted on in the new year.

Bins tilted for cyclists

<u>Litterbugs sully climate summit</u>

Littering is being reported as an unwanted hallmark of the UN climate conference in Glasgow. Residents allege that COP26 attendees litter the ground with packaging and swabs related to COVID-19 lateral flow tests. To attend, proof of a negative test is required. *GlasgowLive* news outlet ran photos of messy scenes on streets and window ledges where litter was left to languish. A strike by cleaners and bin collectors which began Tuesday has compounded the problem.

Eco-activists glue selves to pavement

Climate change protesters from the group Insulate Britain snarled traffic and impeded access to the parliament building on Thursday by gluing themselves to the ground. Police were filmed picking up pipettes associated with the use of superglue, with one officer quipping to the eco-activists: "You're littering, not me." To date 475 court injunctions have been served.
