When no can is in sight, when a bin's overflowing, is no time to litter, is time to keep going. Head held high and with item in hand, Go find a bona fide garbage can.

The University of Ortago in New Zealand has completed a first-ever mapping project to identify where the smokers are. Led by Dr. Amber Pearson and borrowing mapping methods used in archeology, the researchers observed 2600 people in downtown Wellington cafés and bars and found 16 per cent were smoking, a daytime figure that increased at night. From outdoor public areas such as a footpath, 116 smokers could be seen at any one time. Mapping where smokers congregate might spur policies to help reduce the normality of smoking and by extension combat litter, water pollution and cleaning costs.
