#### Space Junk Retrieval Mission Underway

A British-led team demonstrated a system for hauling in the junk littering outer space on Monday, coincidentally, the day after Chinese space station Tiangong-1 blew up over the Pacific Ocean on April 1. Launching from the International Space Centre, the experimental run set in motion the use of the box-like REMOVEDEBRIS satellite, which reins in evermounting space junk using a net and harpoon. Professor Guglielmo Aglietti, director of Surrey Space Centre, said the issue of space debris must be addressed, that a few significant collisions in orbit have already occurred.

#### Butt Blitz heading into Year 4 in Canada (4/3)

A Greener Future has earmarked Sat., May 5, 11 am to 2 pm, for its ambitious Butt Blitz, an event devoted to collecting, counting and recycling cigarette butts across Canada. Dozens of cities need volunteers to remove these hazardous pieces of pesky plastic from sight and turn them into something useful through TerraCycle, an up-cycling biz. Last year's event netted 223,354 butts. **Litter picking just got sweeter here** (4/4)

Neshoba County, Mississippi has increased to \$2 the amount it will pay resident volunteers for each garbage bag they fill with litter. The redemption pilot began last February at 50 cents a bag, but with little take-up, the fee has gone up twice since then.

**Pokémon Go moves into reality mode** (4/5) Pokémon Go gamers, get out your litter sticks! Game maker Niantic announced it will reward players who pick up litter as they play the roving game on Earth Day weekend.
